## Requirements

### Minimum Requirements for Associate of Arts in Bible Studies and a BA Degree in Ministerial Studies

Christian Life College-Madison ("CLC-Madison") operates as an off-campus program of Christian Life College, Mount Prospect, Illinois. CLC in Mount Prospect is the degree granting school. Credits earned at CLC-Madison are certified for both the Associate of Arts (AA) Degree in Biblical Studies and the Bachelors of Arts Degree in Ministerial Studies.

While a total of 64 credits constitutes the minimum credits needed for an AA degree in Biblical Studies through CLC-Madison, students must complete at least 30 of those credits in study at CLC-Madison. Of these 30 credits, 18 must be completed in the classroom and 3 must be completed through field education. Of the remaining 9 credits, 6 may be taken in the classroom or through CLC-Madison's independent study courses. However, these must be Ministerial (MS), Biblical (BI) or Theological (TH) study courses.

While a total of 120 credits constitute the minimum credits needed for a BA degree in Ministerial Studies through CLC-Madison, students must complete at least 60 of those credits in study at CLC-Madison. Of these 60 credits, 30 must be completed in the classroom and 3 must be completed through field education. The remaining credits may be taken in the classroom or through CLC-Madison's independent study courses.

All students are required to take the independent study course, "Introduction to Hermeneutics" for three credits, before their fifth semester of study and the independent study course, "Introduction to Academic Writing" for one credit, before their third semester of study. Any previous credits earned from other institutions (along with credits for life experiences/ministry) will be certified by CLC in Mount Prospect, and, along with these minimum credits from CLC-Madison, will constitute credits earned towards the total of credits needed for the AA or BA degree.

Enrolling students are urged to submit all previous transcripts for certification of credits already earned. Contact your previous institutions and ask them to send those transcripts to CLC-Madison, 4909 East Buckeye Road, Madison, WI 53716.

## Statement of Faith

- I. ***The Inspired Scriptures***  
We believe in the verbal, plenary inspiration of both the Old and New Testaments in their original autographs (II Tim. 3:16-17; I Pet. 2:2; II Pet. 1:21).
- II. ***Special Creation***  
We believe that God created all things in time and space by the power of His Word. The events of the creation week are literally and historically true, and we believe in the Biblical record, including the literal existence of Adam and Eve as the progenitors of all people, the literal full and resultant divine curse on the creation, the worldwide cataclysmic deluge, and the origin of nations and languages at the tower of Babel (Gen. 1-11; John 1:1-3; Col. 1:16; Heb. 1:1-3, 11:3).
- III. ***The Godhead***  
We believe in one God as in a Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. As a person of the Divine Trinity, God the Father is spirit, infinite, sovereign, eternal, unchangeable in all His attributes. He is worthy of honor, adoration and obedience (Gen. 1:26; Deut. 6:4; Isa. 48:16; Matt. 28:19; I Tim. 1:17; John 4:24).
- IV. ***Man and Original Sin***  
We believe that man was created in the image of God, historically fell into sin through Adam, and now the entire human race shares in the depravity of sin (Gen. 1:26; 3:1-24; John 3:3-6; Rom. 5:12, 19; Eph. 1:7, 2:1-5).
- V. ***The Person and Work of Jesus Christ***  
We believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God, born of the Virgin Mary, lived a sinless life, suffered and died a substitutionary death on the cross for the sins of the world (Isa. 7:14; Matt. 1:21-23; Luke 1:26-35; John 5:19, 36; 8:26; Acts 10:38). After His literal physical death as a redemptive sacrifice on the cross, Jesus Christ was literally and historically resurrected and ascended bodily into heaven where He ever lives to make intercession (Acts 2:32, 36; Eph. 1:7; I Cor. 1:17, 18; 15:1-4; II Cor. 5:21; I Pet. 3:28; I John 2:2; Heb. 4:14-16, 7:25).
- VI. ***Salvation***  
We believe that salvation is the gift of God by grace alone and is received through personal faith in the Person and finished work of Christ (John 3:16; Rom. 5:8; 6:23; Eph. 2:4-10; Acts 2:38, 16:3; Heb. 6:1).
- VII. ***The Person and Work of the Holy Spirit***  
We believe in the person of the Holy Spirit, fully God, convicting, regenerating and sanctifying the indwelt believer to live a holy, Christ-like life (John 16:7, 8; 3:3-6; Acts 5:3, 4; Rom. 8:1-6, 8, 9; Gal. 5:17-22; I Cor. 6:11; I Pet. 1:2). The promise of a personal baptism in the Holy Spirit is evidenced by subsequent gifts that empower the believer for a victorious life, the edification of the church and the evangelization of the nations (Mat. 3:11; Mark 16:20; Luke 11:13, 24:46-49; John 7:38, 39; Acts 1:5, 8, 2:4, 32, 33, 39, 5:32; I Cor. 12-14).
